A recent report by VisitBritain shows that 78% of respondents either had, or would be, interested in visiting a TV or film location whilst on holiday. Based on the author's own travels and extensive research, this guidebook features over 80 locations used in seasons 1 to 5 of Outlander. It includes three driving tours, and takes in grand castles, lonely lochs, vast glens, battlefields, country parks, medieval villages and more.
